As we have been going through our 40 days of prayer for church revitalization, I really enjoyed the devotion on Hebrews 10:24-25. In these verses, we are challenged to cheer each other on at Ridgecrest. Just like so many of our members, cheer on their favorite team in Alabama, I hope each person reading this will determine to have a positive attitude toward what God is doing at RBC.

We have been praying for revitalization and we have had a great Kick-Off Sunday and a small group meeting with George Yates and Ken Allen. Now we are creating a team of seven to work with a coach to help Ridgecrest make plans to create a culture of revival and connection in our church. Pray that God will loosen us from any shackles that bind His ministry in our church and that we will obediently pray for a heart of unity to carry out the great commission to glorify God and build-up our body of believers. God is at work; let's do our part to cheer on each other at Ridgecrest.

From your Pastor's Heart:

It's been one year since the Covid-19 Pandemic began for all of us. The first known case in Alabama was identified on March 13, 2020. Since that date we've had 511,779 confirmed Covid-19 cases in our state, and 10,436 deaths. Since that date we have seen most people live more isolated lives, and we've admired people in the medical field (doctors, nurses and those who work alongside them) as well as people in other industries rise up to be "heroes" in our day, working diligently and risking infection and possibly their lives in order to serve people in some way in our region. And while some in our Church family have weathered being infected by the Coronavirus and others have lost dear loved ones because of the virus, all of our lives have been impacted in some way in the past year by the Covid-19 Pandemic.

While I'm glad that vaccinations have arrived and there seems to be "light at the end of the tunnel" in regard to this Pandemic, I'm really curious about what people have learned during this past year. What have we learned about ourselves? What have we learned about people in general around us? And what have we learned about God?

Here are some things I've learned about myself in the last year. I've learned that: 1) I don't like being disconnected from people, but I love spending time with my wife; 2) The ministry work that I do is always tough, but even more so when I can't visit with and/or pray with people in person; 3) It's easy to put on some extra pounds when regular schedules interrupted; and 4) I am so blessed to serve alongside of some of the finest Christians I know at Ridgecrest Baptist Church.

But my primary lessons I've learned have been in what I've learned about the Lord. I've learned that the Lord: 1) provides for and protects His people; 2) uses crisis times like we're going through to get people to reflect on their need for His help in their lives; 3) brings peace to His people's hearts sometimes during the most stress-filled times of their lives; and 4) keeps His Church going regardless of the obstacles and opposition it faces (Matthew 16:19).

Every church I know faces the same challenge we do at Ridgecrest; how do we get people back to in-person services? Easter Sunday is a great day to come back to church. Jesus has RISEN and His power over death can empower us to get up and celebrate HE LIVES with all your church family in-person. I look forward to seeing all your beautiful faces on Easter Sunday, 4/4/21!
